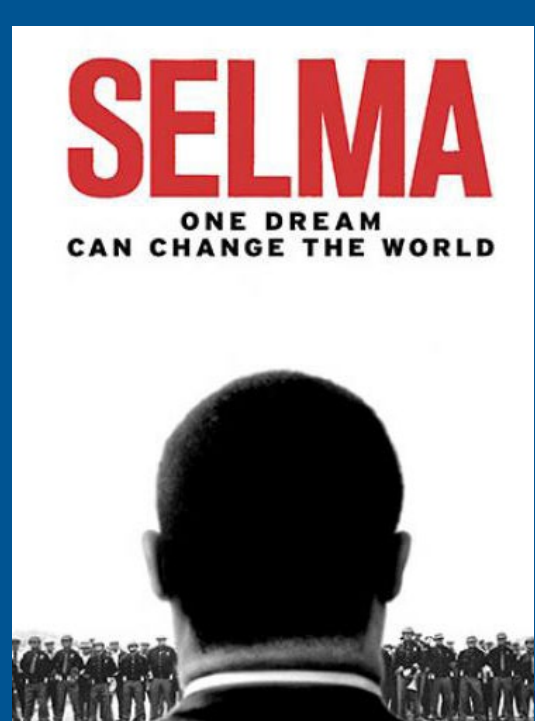


Crash
